Words, Spaces and Actions: Black Theology approach to embodying change and social transformation. The idea is to look at the differing ways in which Black Theology in Britain seeks to embody change, whether in terms of our thoughts and the words we use to talk about God – including reflections on the *King James Bible*, whose publication and the 400th anniversary we ‘celebrate’ this year – or the kind of spaces we employ in order to attempt to live and practice liberation or in the activities we undertake for the self same ends.

This year's conference will address various aspects of what it means to embody change and transformation. We are interested in the different ways Black people interpret their lived experiences and seek to use their belief in God as a means giving expression to ‘New Life’. This desire for change may be in terms of different forms of ecclesial (Church) space we have developed, or how our interaction with words (Sacred or Temporal) have helped shaped our sense of reality and the future.
